# Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Commissioners Fishers Island Ferry District May 24, 2021

Chairman Jim Reid called a meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Fishers Island Ferry District (the "Ferry District") to order on May 24, 2021, at 4:00 PM at the Island Community Center and via teleconference.

Commissioners Ace Ahrens, Heather Burnham and Dianna Shillo were present. Also in attendance were Geb Cook, Gordon Murphy and Deanna Ross. Commissioner Tom Cashel was absent. Mr. David McCall was present via teleconference.

Chairman Reid established that a quorum was present. Everyone in attendance pledged allegiance to the flag.

**Correspondence/Public Comment** - Mr. Murphy reported that he received correspondence from Sara Porter this afternoon regarding fill in clergy for Union Chapel. The BOC have agreed to discuss later. There was no public comment.

**Finance** - Mr. Cook reviewed financial statements from January 1 through May 24, 2001. Highlights included car and traffic up \$260,000 from 2020 and up \$100,000 from 2019. Freight is up \$40,000 year over year. Ferry repairs were up due to replacement of the haul plate on Race Point. Total payroll is down \$30,000 year over year. Net income is \$563,709 and the fund balance is healthy.

## **Management Reports**

**MU/RP/Silver Eel Updates** - Mr. Cook updated the BOC. MV Munnatawket is running back and forth with no new news to report. Painting and interior work continues on the MV Race Point. The USCG Certificate of Inspection and Sea Trial are scheduled for tomorrow. Management is hopeful to have the boat back on Wednesday, May 26, with training of the captains on Wednesday and Thursday and back in service on Friday, May 28<sup>th</sup>, for the holiday weekend. Management will make decisions tomorrow night regarding adding additional reservation space for the upcoming weekend. The MV Silver Eel engine is expected to arrive sometime this week but awaiting a call back.

**Airport Road -** Mr. Cook reported that paving is expected to be completed in June 2021, but more information will be available in the coming days.

Hanger - Mr. Cook reported that Jim Ski has started foundation work for the hanger.

**Seawall Project -** Mr. Cook reported that a letter was sent to FEMA last Friday for approval of the additional mitigation measures. The project remains on track and Mattern Construction is ready to go.

**Other** - Commissioner Burnham stated that she has heard reports of lack of mask wearing on the ferries, in terminal buildings and at freight. Discussion ensued. Management will remind employees, the community and customers of the FIFD's rules and expectations regarding mask wearing.
