# Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Commissioners Fishers Island Ferry District February 5, 2018

Commissioner Ahrens at the Fishers Island Community Center called a meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Fishers Island Ferry District ("the Ferry District") to order on February 5, 2018 at 4:30 PM.

Commissioners Peter Rugg and Dianna Shillo were present. Also in attendance were Geb Cook and Gordon Murphy. Diane Hansen was present via phone. Commissioners Heather Burnham and William Bloethe were absent.

Commissioner Ahrens established that a quorum was present. Everyone in attendance pledged allegiance to the flag.

**Correspondence/Public Comment** – Mr. Cook reported that correspondence was received from Sarah Porter regarding the Island Community Center Fireworks Cruise. This will be discussed as an agenda item during the meeting. There was no public comment.

### **Management Reports**

Munnatawket/Race Point Update - Mr. Burns is en route back from Fairhaven Shipyard and Mr. Cook updated the BOC. The Munnatawket is returning to the New London terminal from Fairhaven Shipyard on February 6, 2018. The vessel will remain docked for approximately two weeks to continue work outside of the shipyard package. In addition, some of the bridge windows did not fit properly and once the new windows are received, Fairhaven will return and address. A series of change orders were received and clarified last Friday and approved late today and a resolution will follow at the next BOC meeting. Discussion ensued regarding ways in which to encourage passengers to make vehicle reservations as well as ideas to discount small sized vehicles but charge more for larger vehicles. The Race Point has been running fine and no issues reported.

**Airport Hangar Update** - Mr. Cook updated the BOC. Mr. Cook sent FD attorney, Martin Finnegan an example from Gabreski Airport where there is a leased facility built on public land for public benefit. Mr. Cook has not received any response from Mr. Finnegan.

**Docko/SEC Dredging** - Mr. Cook updated the BOC. The FIFD has received approval from the DEC to move ahead with the sampling plan from the rack. Three samples will be obtained from the rack and sent for analytical testing. Once sampling results are back then the FIFD can move forward with the permits.

**Burn Plan 2018**- Chairman Ahrens updated the BOC. In efforts to conserve native grasslands and maintain airport safety, controlled rotational burns take place annually around Elizabeth field. A proposed plan has been submitted to the DEC requesting that a permit be granted at the DEC's earliest convenience in order to allow for the largest window of time allowing for favorable burn conditions, coordination of personnel and the completion of all burning prior to May 1, 2018 so as not to interfere with birds nesting in the preserve. Mr. Ahrens will inquire about possible dates for burning at the monthly Fishers Island Fire Department meeting February 6, 2018.

**Island Community Center Fireworks Cruise 2018** - The Island Community Center has requested a ferry charter on Saturday, July 14, 2018 for its annual Fireworks Cruise during Sailfest.

**Hovercraft** - Mr. Cook updated the BOC. Mr. Tom Murray has reached out to Mr. Cook and is asking if the FIFD is interested in working together for the 2018 season. Mr. Murray has stated that he would only be operating one hovercraft with a 12 person capacity and 2 crew members. Management has recommended that the BOC agree to one more year. Discussion ensued regarding the season length, cancellations and notifications to passengers in the event of cancellations, as well as modifying the current business model to allow for guaranteed revenue. Mr. Cook will respond to Mr. Murray and discuss these specific issues raised by the BOC.

**FIFD 2017 Achievements and 2018 Plans -** Mr. Cook distributed and reviewed FIFD 2017 Achievements and 2018 Draft Goals.

**BOC 2018 Goals** - Commissioner Rugg reported that he has received responses via email from most BOC members regarding their satisfaction with the 2018 BOC goals.

sured, subject to the approval of Ferry District Counsel.
