Management Reports

Marine Update - Mr. Haney updated the BOC. Last week, there was an issue on the 7am run of Race Point which caused operation at a reduced speed. The problem was quickly resolved when the boat returned to New London. Munnatawket is heading to the shipyard tomorrow and will be there for six weeks. The boat will return February 23, 2024. New generators will be installed during the shipyard. Mr. Haney spoke with Cross Sound Ferry and The Caribbean is a viable boat if needed. Due to upcoming weather, this week's cargo run has been moved to Tuesday. The times will remain the same.

Traffic Update - Mr. Haney updated the BOC. Traffic numbers were up for October, November and December 2023. Overall for the year, passengers were up by 3,000. Autos up by 200 and commercial up by 1,000. Traffic numbers remain lower than pre-covid; however, continue to climb.

New Boat Design Phase - Mr. Cook updated the BOC. Mr. Cook reported that the Ferry District did not get awarded the Federal Transit Administration grant. Mr. Cook stated that they will try again. Mr. Cook received some sample RFPs from other ferries and is working with someone who has experience with new boat RFPs. Along with Elliot Bay, Mr. Cook and Mr. Haney have been talking with Incat Crowther who works closely with Gladding-Hearn Shipbuilding. Both companies are interested in our project. Discussion ensued among the BOC and Crew regarding design possibilities of the new boat.

Ferry Wifi - Commission Reid reported that he has been researching possibilities of getting WiFi on the boats through StarLink and ROAM Set. Commissioner Reid would like this to be a free service and will work with Mr. Cook.

Backhoe Repair - Mr. McCall reported that the ferry owns a backhoe that is in need of repairs that will cost \$38,000. Discussion ensued and it was determined that the Ferry District does not need it. The district will look at options to sale the backhoe.

Property Lease Update - Mr. Cook reported that Goldberg is moving forward with evaluating all the districts properties and rewriting of new leases.
